Webinar Description

A global conversation around how to use technology to effectively deliver teacher professional development

The event brought together a diverse group of education stakeholders to engage in a conversation around improving teaching practices and learning outcomes through quality professional development for teachers at scale. Participants were encouraged to share their experience with teacher professional development both the challenges and solutions.

Key Takeaways

- Participants expressed **concern for teacher burnout due to COVID**, resulting in a lot of teachers leaving the profession
- A **lack of planning time is a huge issue**, teachers are being forced to plan on their off time instead of planning sessions
- **Lack of resources and respect for the profession** was discussed
- There is a **need for scalable low tech solutions**
- **Solutions should be flexible**: adapting between times and solutions
- Teacher training programs should be preparing students to adapt to changes in the role
- **Organizational learning should be supported by strategic opportunities for teachers and admins to learn together** so they are growing the whole organization
- **There needs to be an equal emphasis on their mindsets, motivation, recognition**

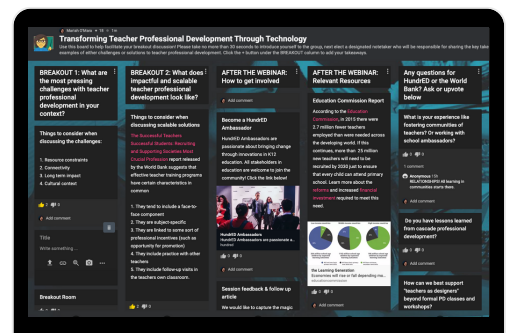
